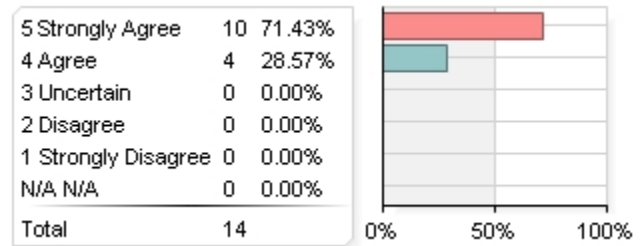

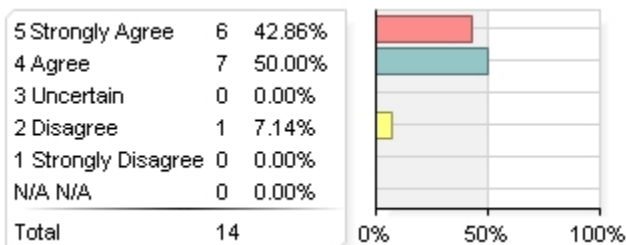

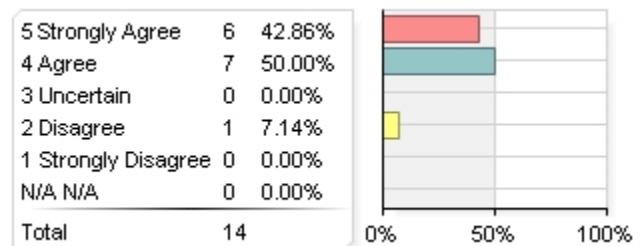

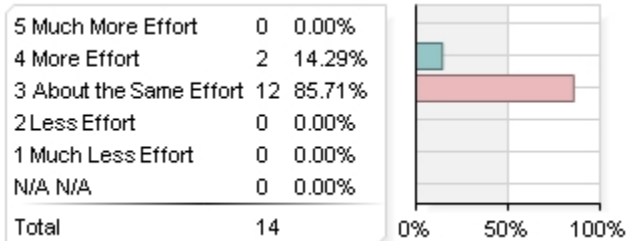

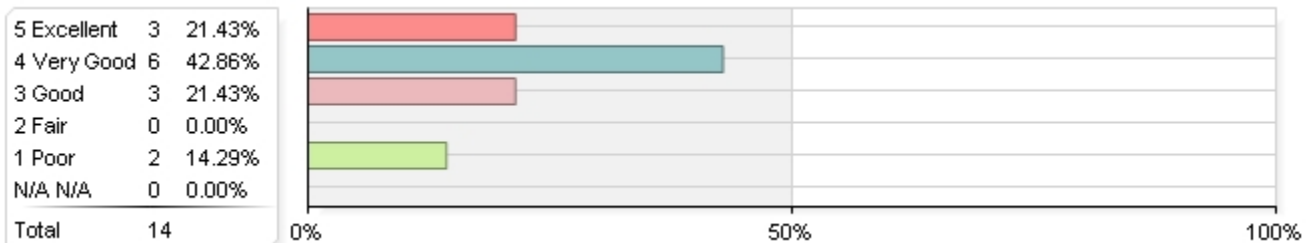

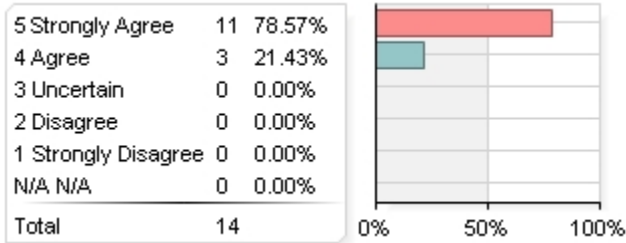
How would you rate this course overall?

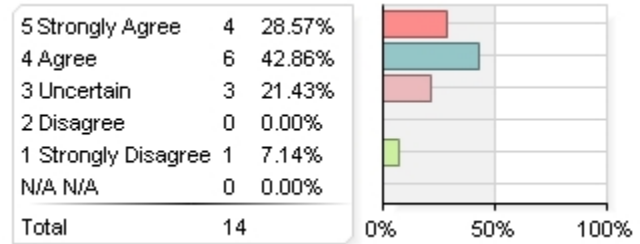

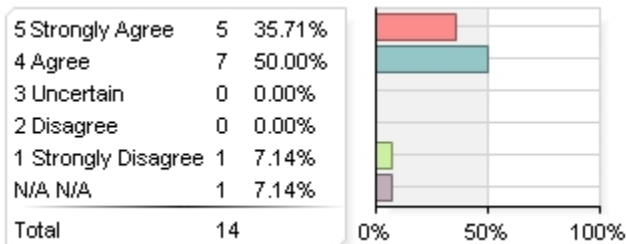

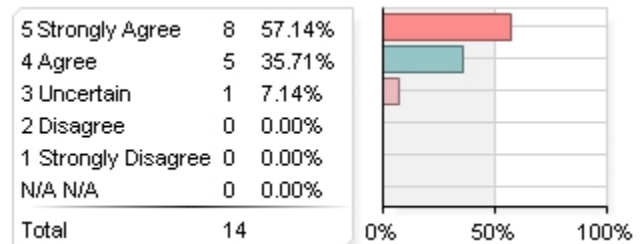

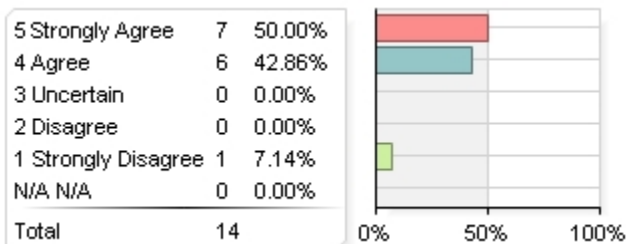

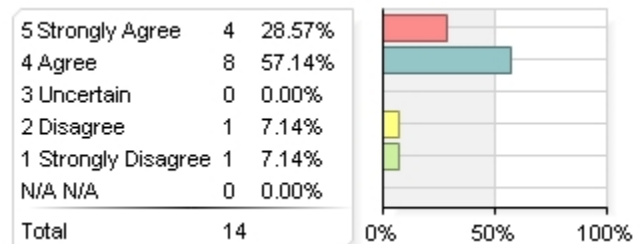

I wish that the deadline for discussion questions was later on Wednesday night...perhaps even 8 or 9pm. Many students are in class at 5pm.
One thing that I would think would definitely improve the course would be to have our assignments and discussions show up in the assignment notification bar on canvas, this facilitates remembering to get the discussions done beforehand and follows assignment notification patterns of other courses. Also, our discussions were normally due at 5pm the day before class discussion, I strongly think it would be better suited to have this deadline later in the evening or at midnight since it doesn't take into account students that have jobs outside of class and 5pm falls into normal working hours.

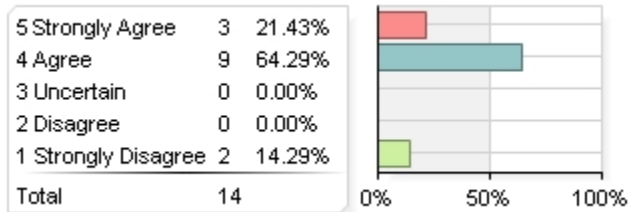

I think the group assignment should be altered so that it is more encompassing of the types of things we learn in class (i.e. methods, different experimental paradigms used in developmental psych etc., rather than data analysis)

I do not feel that I learned anything during this class except for how to dissect a study on infancy according to how Sophie likes them analyzed.
